### Sunflower Seed Sale...Sold Out!!!



On December 3rd, for the first time ever, the FOPFC sold the Sunflower seeds grown at Pope Farm Conservancy to the public. The Friends sold a total of 5,400 lbs. of seed in 3 ½ hours. There was an incredible response to the sale. Thanks to all of you for your support, and thanks to the Town of Middleton for letting us sell the seed out of the Conservancy parking lot. The Friends had a great time selling the seeds, and the farmer was very pleased.

#### Why did the Friends sell the Sunflower seed this year?

They did it primarily to help the farmer cover his costs. In the past, the farmer has sold the sunflower seeds to a local wholesaler, who in turn sells the seed to a regional retailer, who then sells the seed for bird feed. But this year, the retailer had "single sourced" the seed, which

left the farmer holding the seed and in a quandary. So, the FOPFC board made the decision to purchase the bagged seeds from the farmer and sell them directly to the public at our cost plus a handling fee for labeling, etc.

Our goal in this project was to help the farmer out and to help cover his costs. We did this successfully, and it will help keep Sunflower Days viable in the future.



### **Bald Eagle Spotted at PFC**

We have a new addition to Pope Farm Conservancy... a bald eagle! The farmer saw it in mid-November when he was doing some harvesting, and then one of our members sighted it in the trees again a week later. It's the first time we know of that eagles have been seen in the Conservancy.



### **Questions of the Month**

#### Why are Sunflowers grown at PFC?

It is difficult to grow sunflowers in the climate and soil here in South Central Wisconsin. People seldom grow sunflowers commercially in this area because it is far more profitable to grow corn and soybeans. At Pope Farm Conservancy, the farmer is asked to grow 7 different crops (corn, soybeans, alfalfa, timothy, wheat, oats, and... sunflowers), and in turn, he receives a reduced lease rate on the land. Over the last 9 years, the farmer has actually lost money on the sunflower crop. However, he does make money on the more profitable crops at the Conservancy, and that makes growing the sunflowers possible. The farmer also does things to the Sunflower field, to his expense, to make the field more attractive, i.e. cutting out areas for photo opportunities and mowing down parts of the field that are not growing well. Consequently, PFC has had stunning Sunflower fields over the years that have been an attraction to tens of thousands of people. The farmer's seed supplier has gone out of business, and he is currently researching where he can get the type of seed he needs to plant in 2017.
