Bees and Pollinators Talk

Tuesday, June 28, 2016 (6:30 - 8:00 pm)

Host: Jeremy Hemberger, UW-Madison Department of Entomology

UW-Madison graduate student Jeremy Hemberger spends his days examining the behavioral patterns of colonies of bumblebees. How does he do it? He tracks them with small radio tags. Cool, huh?!

Join Jeremy at the Pope Farm Conservancy on June 28th to learn about bumblebees, the plants that sustain them, and how their environment affects them. Together, you'll explore his active research project, and see how bumblebees are tracked using radio frequency identification. Additionally, Jeremy will discuss the other, closely related wild bee species that share the Conservancy with the humble bumblebee.

Sunflower Days!!

July 23 - July 31, 2016

Sunflower Days at Pope Farm Conservancy is currently scheduled for <u>July 23 – July 31, 2016</u>. The weather has dictated that we plant early, which will result in Sunflower Days being a week earlier than usual. ** IMPORTANT NOTE **

This year, the crop rotation required that the Sunflower field be located in the "Back Forty," and so the viewing area will be in the <u>center</u> of the Conservancy. That means ALL visitors will be required to hike approximately 1-mile (round-trip) to view and photograph the sunflowers. Please keep this in mind as you consider visiting Sunflower Days! We think it will be worth the effort.

Volunteers Needed for Sunflower Days!

The FOPFC sponsors Sunflower Days for the enjoyment of the general public. It is free and provides smiles to thousands of visitors. Along the way, it serves to increase the awareness of Pope Farm Conservancy so that more people will enjoy the land and its stories.

The Friends also use this event as our primary fundraiser. First, we need to pay for the expenses created by Sunflower Days like Insurance, signage, parking paint, and the list goes on. Secondly, we are trying to raise funds to improve the quality of the prairies at PFC, involve the community to help to maintain the conservancy, and work on developing more educational opportunities for people of all ages.

To do this, we need <u>many</u> volunteers over the 9 days of Sunflower Days to help with parking, water sales, retail sales, or just greeting the public.



There are approx. 35 shifts to fill during this 9-day event, and we need at least 2 volunteers per shift. Please, please, we need your help! The shifts are usually 2 hours in duration, and we will train you. It really is a lot of fun!

Friends of Pope Farm Conservancy opposes this request because it would have an adverse impact on the tranquility at the Conservancy. Setting this precedent could lead to other clubs and organizations using amplifying equipment on a consistent basis throughout the week during the summer months.



Question of the Month

What is the status of Water Tower location across the road from PFC?

The Water Tower is going to be built across from the Conservancy on Old Sauk Rd. in the spring of 2017. It has been planned for many years, and now the question has arisen as to the exact placement of the tower. The Friends have become involved in the process because we are trying to preserve the viewing and photo shed from the top of the hill across the valley that includes the homestead. The photo below hangs in the main lobby of the UW Hospital on the UW campus. It shows the view we are trying to protect.



We attended a number of meetings and hearings with the Madison Water Utility board, and have gained support from the Town of Middleton. The choices that remain are shown on the map below. You can see that the sites that would interfere with this viewing shed have been eliminated. The water tower will be 170' high (17 stories), and it will certainly have an impact on the landscape, however it appears we will be able to continue photographing this incredibly popular view over the Sunflowers Fields in the future.


