Annual Tour of Pope Farm Conservancy

Tuesday, August 7th, 2018 (6:00 - 7:30 pm) * Meet at the top of the hill *



Bring your friends, family and neighbors and join archaeologist Dr. Amy Rosebrough of the WI Historical Society on a fascinating exploration of Pope Farm Conservancy. Learn about the Conservancy's unique history, geology, prairies, soils, glacial features and 20 different vegetative plots. Amy will share the stories of the people who lived and worked on the land over thousands of years. Prairie Tour on July 14th, 2018

On Saturday, July 14, community members and Friends of Pope Farm Conservancy joined Mike Anderson on a beautiful scenic tour of the conservancy's six different prairies and restored Oak Savanna. Mike guided 27 tour participants around the conservancy as he explained how the prairies were created and nurtured throughout the years to create biologically diverse ecosystems. As the



tour progressed through the conservancy, Mike discussed the key differences between the six prairies, highlighting how and where the many different native plants thrive. Engaged tour participants had many questions, including how to address invasive species without threatening local ecosystems. A huge thank you to Mike and everyone who attended the tour!

Question of the Month

Question: Will the FOPFC host Sunflower Days in the future?

Answer: This letter was sent to the Town of Middleton last month, and explains the FOPFC

position on its future involvement with Sunflower Days.

RE: Friends of Pope Farm Conservancy/Sunflower Days

Dear Cyndi:

As you know, the Friends (FOPFC), with the permission and support of the Town of Middleton, have been hosting the annual Sunflower Days event for the past several years. This year, the FOPFC declined to host the event because of our unresolved concerns regarding the large number of attendees, the inadequate parking caused by the large number of attendees and the safety issues which we believe would result from off-site parking.

After discussion by the Town Board, the Board also decided that it would not go forward with its own hosting of Sunflower Days for 2018 with the result being that no such event is occurring this year. Looking to the future, the FOPFC has carefully analyzed the amount of effort and the number of volunteers required by our hosting of the event. Most recently, by our calculations and records, we required approximately 2,500 hours of volunteer work in order to host the event. We compared that with approximately 700 hours of volunteer work for Prairie Restoration and approximately 400 hours of volunteer work dedicated to education. We compared these committed hours of volunteer time in these three separate categories with the purpose and mission clause set forth in both our bylaws and our 501(3)(c) application and concluded that we have significantly strayed from our mission statement. Our Board of Directors has discussed this at length and concluded that we need to refocus our time and effort on our purpose and mission statements which emphasize prairie restoration and education. This

effort on our purpose and mission statements which emphasize prairie restoration and education. This realization caused our Board to decide that it was no longer appropriate for the FOPFC to host Sunflower Days in the future. Having made this decision at the Board level, we also wanted to promptly communicate this decision to the Town of Middleton Board so that it would have ample time to do its own planning with respect to potential future Sunflower Days events.
