The work is about 2 weeks ahead of schedule. The school is slated to open in the fall of 2020.

Pope Farm Conservancy to Receive \$105,000 Grant

Dane County recently approved \$105,000 of funding to the Town of Middleton for repairs to the iconic erosion ravine below the CCC spillway. The ravine (pictured below) sustained major damage during the record rainfall in August 2018 when heavy runoff eroded back slopes and threatened the stability of the mowed trails on each side of the gully. It is anticipated that repairs will be made in 2020.

In the interim, the town has undertaken measures to minimize further damage. Left unchecked, the back slopes would be expected to erode further.

Screened Trail to be Repaired in Spring 2020

The screened trail that runs along the stone fence has had serious erosion problems for the last several years. The town plans on repairing the trail for the 2020 summer season.

Winter Activities & Parking



For a truly wonderful winter experience, head out to Pope Farm Conservancy where the crisp air and beautiful trails await you. The conservancy is open from sunrise to sunset all year-round. It's a great place to enjoy hiking, snow shoeing, cross country skiing and sledding (weather permitting).

Please be advised that the Blackhawk Parking lot off Blackhawk Road is closed during winter months. We recommend parking in the lower parking area off Old Sauk Road.

Question of the Month

Question: Why fix the flood damage in the ravine?

Answer: The record rainfall in August of 2018 caused incredible damage everywhere. At the ravine location there was approximately 14" of rainfall. The water flowed so hard that it eroded the sides of the ravine, and caused extensive damage. The ravine itself is a prairie restoration project and significant damage was done to the prairie plants that went down with the mudslide. The long-term risk is that if the erosion continues, it would eventually begin eroding to the east and to the west. The result would be continuing damage to the Blackhawk Prairie and destruction to the trails surrounding the ravine. Eventually the damage could destroy significant areas of the Conservancy and the surrounding property.

In 1938, the Civilian Conservation Corps built the spillway to stop erosion of the hillside. As can be seen in the photo below, water was actually coming in from the sides of the ravine. It has been estimated that the water was eroding these waterways an average of 6 feet per year. Of course, the erosion in 1938 was more established than the recent erosion damage, but it shows what can happen if the problem is not addressed.
