Wildflowers in the Conservancy: Prairie Tour & Workshop Saturday, August 14, 2021 at 10am Speaker: Jeff Steele from Wild Ones Madison

The Town of Middleton board has approved a project for repairs to eroded slopes on the east side of the ravine at Pope Farm Conservancy. A fence is also to be installed next to an eroded slope on the west side. Severe damage to the slopes occurred in August 2018 as the result of record rainfall in the area. The project will be funded up to \$105,000 by a grant from Dane County. Completion of the work will be dependent on contractor availability and weather conditions. Vierbicher Engineers is in charge of the project.

Education Team Update

On July 23rd Trel Gimber and Doug Piper met with the 4th grade team at the Pope Farm Elementary School. We talked about the 4th grade field trips in the past, and improvements that can be made in the future. They were very enthusiastic about being able to use our German Immigration and CCC Legacy videos as an introduction and resource for their lessons, and the and the Geology videos when complete. The teachers plan to begin using our German Immigration materials in September.

We brainstormed several interactive lessons such as games a child would play in the middle of the 19th century. A problem-solving task for one team might be figuring out how to get water to the cabin. The Friends will have a volunteer on site when lessons are unfolding depending on the topic. This is a first year, and many of the materials from our prepared lessons will be incorporated when appropriate.

Overall, the 4th grade team seemed very excited about using the Conservatory as a resource.
