Recap of June Programs

Spring Migration Birding Tour - June 3rd

Mike McDowell marched 27 attendees up and down the conservancy woodland terrain, along the spillway and through the open prairies listening for bird songs. The rules were clearly stated: "stay quiet and stay behind him". Mike continuously pointed out various bird calls and the bird's whereabouts. Though he believes there are close to 200 bird species residing in the conservancy, this year he noted several have been absent. The 80+ degree heat this day apparently kept many birds less active. Birds do not nest in the prairies but feed in them while nesting in the woodlands.

The brightly colored Eastern bluebirds, Indigo bunting and the Baltimore Oriole and Orchard Oriole were great finds for the attendees to view. Mike claimed to have learned bird identification on his own with frequent observation field trips. Identification is done primarily through song, sighting, time of day and year and general impression of size, shape, flight pattern, habitat where found and the elimination process. Mike challenged the Merlin app to be as quick and accurate as he in identifying birds. He referenced ornithology reference books and shared ornithology research findings made from recording bird songs. Tree swallows, for example, share a complex repertory of songs with fellow tree swallows within their gang that are used to test newcomers to the gang. The newcomers have to pass singing the repertory before they can be accepted. Another example are the Chickadees who regularly pass along specific alerts of danger to other chickadees. Other birds may pick up on these alerts as well. The Birds of North America resource book is available online.

A High school-age attendee said he was "amazed that Mike was so knowledgeable about birds".

Some birds present and identified by Mike during the 2 hour tour included: Common yellowthroat, Song sparrow, Killdeer, Barn swallow, Tree swallow, Red-wing blackbird, House finch, Blue jay, Hummingbird, Eastern bluebird, Robin, Crow, Clay colored sparrow, Eastern kingbird, Starlings, Baltimore and orchard orioles, Field sparrow, Grackle, Meadowlark, Eastern wood pewee, House wren, Catbird, Red tailed Hawk, Brown thrasher, Cowbird, Indigo bunting, Gnatcatcher, Cedar waxwing, Redbellied woodpecker, Goldfinch, Chickadee and Cardinal.

CCC Spillway Maintenance is Complete

The spillway maintenance project has now been completed. The cracks have been filled, the spalling repaired, and the spillway has been resealed. This spillway was built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1938 and is the topic of several educational lessons at the conservancy. The structure is designed to reduce the velocity of water run-off from the surrounding fields. Built 85 years ago, the spillway works very effectively to this day. This maintenance effort will help preserve this historical structure into the future. The Friends and the Town of Middleton split the cost of this project.
